# Hildegard of Bingen

Name: Hildegard of Bingen
Dates: 1098-1179
Musical period: Medieval
Nationality: German
Worked in: Bingen (Rhine Valley)
Selected important works: Ordo Vitutum – a play with music notated with neumes
Interesting information: One of the earliest known composers, she was also a poet, mystic and scientist, and founded a nunnery in Bingen, Germany, and is revered in that country.

# <u>Léonin</u>

Name: Léonin Dates: c.1130-1190 Musical period: Medieval Nationality: French Worked in: Paris Selected important works: *Magnus Liber* – a book of organum for the choir of Notre Dame Interesting information: Worked at the newly built Notre Dame Cathedral, and best known for polyphonic organum.

# <u>Pérotin</u>

Name: Pérotin Dates: c.1160-c.1220 Musical period: Medieval Nationality: French Worked in: Paris Selected important works: Magnus Liber – possibly a pupil of Léonin, he probably revised this work and added his own compositions. Interesting information: Little is known about him, but he probably worked at Notre Dame around the same time as Léonin.

# <u>Halle</u>

Name: Adam de la Halle
Dates: c.1237-1288
Musical period: Medieval
Nationality: French
Worked in: Travelled throughout France
Selected important works: The Play of Robin and Marion
Interesting information: The above work is possibly the earliest surviving example of a French play with music.

# <u>Machaut</u>

Name: Guillaume de Machaut Dates: c.1300-1377 Musical period: Medieval Nationality: French Worked in: Rheims, France

### Selected important works: Messe de Notre Dame

**Interesting information:** Wrote sacred and secular music in the Ars Nova style – the most important 14<sup>th</sup> century composer known to us today.

#### <u>Dunstable</u>

Name: John Dunstable Dates: c.1390-1453 Musical period: Medieval Nationality: English Worked in: Travelled throughout Europe Selected important works: Masses and Motets Interesting information: Very influential composer, especially on Dufay.

#### <u>Dufay</u>

Name: Guillaume Dufay Dates: 1397-1474 Musical period: Medieval Nationality: Flemish Worked in: Cambrai, France, and all over Italy Selected important works: Mass of the Armed Man Interesting information: The most famous and revered composer of his day.

### **Ockeghem**

Name: Jean d'Ockeghem Dates: c.1410-1497 Musical period: Medieval/Renaissance Nationality: Flemish Worked in: Northern France Selected important works: Not much survives, but we do have 14 Masses of his. Interesting information: Very important composer of sacred music.

### <u>Josquin</u>

Name: Josquin des Prez Dates: c.1440-1521 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: Flemish Worked in: Italy and France Selected important works: Messe de Beata Virgine Interesting information: Famous and revered in his day, did as much to cement Renaissance style as Mozart in the Classical period.

#### **Obrecht**

Name: Jacob Obrecht Dates: c.1451-1505 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: Flemish Worked in: Netherlands and Ferrara, Italy Selected important works: Masses and Motets Interesting information: Used secular tunes and number symbolism in his sacred music. <u>Willaert</u> Name: Adrian Willaert Dates: c.1490-1562 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: Flemish Worked in: Venice Selected important works: Antiphonal sacred music, Italian madrigals Interesting information: Choirmaster at St. Mark's, Venice.

# <u>Walter</u>

Name: Johann Walter Dates: 1496-1570 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: German Worked in: Various cities in Germany Selected important works: Chorales and motets Interesting information: Edited the first Protestant hymnal in Germany, which had a forward by Martin Luther himself.

# <u>Tallis</u>

Name: Thomas Tallis
Dates: c.1505-1585
Musical period: Renaissance
Nationality: English
Worked in: Canterbury and London
Selected important works: Spem in Alium (c.1570) – 40-part motet
Interesting information: Wrote both in English and Latin, depending on the religion of the day in England. Organist and composer to the Chapel Royal during Elizabeth I's reign.

# <u>A. Gabrieli</u>

Name: Andrea Gabrieli Dates: c.1510-1586 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: Italian Worked in: Venice Selected important works: Antiphonal sacred music Interesting information: Pupil of Willaert and took over St. Mark's post from him.

### <u>Palestrina</u>

Name: Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina Dates: c.1525-1594 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: Italian Worked in: Rome Selected important works: *Missa Papae Marcelli* (1567), *Stabat Mater* (1590) Interesting information: Pleased the Council of Trent with his uncluttered, beautiful Mass and Motet settings.

<u>Lassus</u> Name: Orlande de Lassus Dates: c.1532-1594 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: Flemish Worked in: Munich Selected important works: Psalmi Davidis Poenitentiales (1584), many motets Interesting information: Worked in Italy and Germany, and traveled much. Known for sacred and secular music.

# <u>Byrd</u>

Name: William Byrd Dates: c.1543-1623 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: English Worked in: Lincoln and London Selected important works: Cantiones Sacrae (1575, jointly with Tallis), many Masses, instrumental music Interesting information: Pupil of Tallis who also worked at the Chapel Royal. His secular music was as popular as his sacred music, especially with the Queen.

# <u>Victoria</u>

Name: Tomás Luis de Victoria
Dates: c.1548-1611
Musical period: Renaissance
Nationality: Spanish
Worked in: Rome and Madrid
Selected important works: Missa pro Victoria, numerous Magnificats
Interesting information: Only wrote sacred music. Trained in Italy (possibly with Palestrina) but was mainly based in Spain.

# <u>Caccini</u>

Name: Giulio Caccini Dates: c.1550-1618 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: Italian Worked in: Florence Selected important works: Le Nuove Musiche (1601) Interesting information: Co-founder of the Florentine Camerata (see Peri, below).

# <u>Morley</u>

Name: Thomas Morley Dates: 1557-1602 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: English Worked in: England Selected important works: Editor of *The Triumphs of Oriana* – a collection of madrigals Interesting information: Pupil of Byrd and possible friend of Shakespeare.

<u>G. Gabrieli</u> Name: Giovanni Gabrieli Dates: 1557-1612 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: Italian Worked in: Venice Selected important works: Antiphonal sacred and secular music such as *Sonata pian*' e forte (1597 for brass) Interesting information: Nephew of Andrea who inherited the post at St Mark's, Venice, from him.

# <u>Gesualdo</u>

Name: Carlo Gesualdo Dates: c.1560-1613 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: Italian Worked in: Naples Selected important works: Madrigals Interesting information: Murdered his wife and her lover, and went steadily insane as he got older. His music has been more popular recently than it was in his day.

# <u>Peri</u>

Name: Jacopo Peri Dates: 1561-1621 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: Italian Worked in: Florence Selected important works: Operas Interesting information: With Caccini, a member of the Florentine Camerata, a group that created the earliest operas.

### <u>Dowland</u>

Name: John Dowland Dates: c.1563-1626 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: English Worked in: England and Denmark Selected important works: Flow my Tears; Lachrimae Interesting information: Travelling singer and royal lutenist to James I.

# <u>Monteverdi</u>

Name: Claudio Monteverdi
Dates: 1567-1643
Musical period: Renaissance/Baroque
Nationality: Italian
Worked in: Mantua, Venice
Selected important works: Orfeo (1607), Vespers of the Blessed Virgin (1610)
Interesting information: Extremely important composer who wrote prolifically in almost all genres of the day, including one of the first operas.

<u>Wilbye</u> Name: John Wilbye Dates: 1574-1638 Musical period: Renaissance Nationality: English Worked in: England Selected important works: Two books of madrigals Interesting information: Considered one of the best of the English madrigalists.

#### <u>Weelkes</u>

Name: Thomas Weelkes
Dates: c.1576-1623
Musical period: Renaissance
Nationality: English
Worked in: England
Selected important works: Three books of madrigals
Interesting information: Friend of Morley and contributor to *The Triumphs of Oriana*. Studied at Oxford and became organist of Chichester Cathedral.

# <u>Allegri</u>

Name: Gregorio Allegri Dates: 1582-1652 Musical period: Renaissance/Baroque Nationality: Italian Worked in: Rome Selected important works: Miserere (c1630) Interesting information: Allegri's famous Mise

**Interesting information:** Allegri's famous *Miserere* was reserved for exclusive performance in the Sistine Chapel, and therefore was not heard anywhere else until Mozart heard it in 1770 and wrote it out from memory.

### <u>Schütz</u>

Name: Heinrich Schütz Dates: 1585-1672 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: German Worked in: Dresden (but trained in Venice) Selected important works: Christmas Oratorio (1660), Passions (1664-66) Interesting information: Did much to develop the German tradition of sacred music, subsequently championed by Bach.

# <u>Carissimi</u>

Name: Giacomo Carissimi Dates: 1605-1674 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: Italian Worked in: Rome Selected important works: Oratorios and Motets Interesting information: Brought Monteverdi's opera style to church music.

# <u>Couperin</u>

Name: Francois Couperin Dates: c.1626-1661 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: French Worked in: Versailles Selected important works: Over 200 works for harpischord Interesting information: Worked at the courts of Louis XIV and XV.

### <u>Lully</u>

Name: Jean-Baptiste Lully Dates: 1632-1687 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: Italian Worked in: Versailles, Paris Selected important works: Operas and Ballets, including Armide (1686) Interesting information: The court composer of Louis XIV, and originator of French opera. Died from an infection resulting from hitting his foot with a stick whilst beating time.

# <u>Buxtehude</u>

Name: Dietrich Buxtehude
Dates: c.1637-1707
Musical period: Baroque
Nationality: Danish
Worked in: Lübeck, Germany
Selected important works: Organ music and cantatas
Interesting information: As a youth, Bach walked miles in order to hear Buxtehude play the organ.

Charpentier Name: Marc-Antoine Charpentier Dates: c.1643-1704 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: French Worked in: Paris Selected important works: Te Deum (c.1690), Les Arts Florissants (1686 opera) Interesting information: For a time, Charpentier was the composer for playwrght Moliere's new productions.

# <u>Pachelbel</u>

Name: Johann Pachelbel Dates: 1653-1706 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: German Worked in: Various cities in Germany Selected important works: Canon in D, organ music Interesting information: Knew the Bach family and was a major influence on J.S. Bach.

# <u>Corelli</u>

Name: Archangelo Corelli Dates: 1653-1713 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: Italian Worked in: Rome **Selected important works:** Sonatas and Concerti Grossi **Interesting information:** A violinist whose instrumental music influenced Handel greatly.

 Purcell

 Name: Henry Purcell

 Dates: 1659-1695

 Musical period: Baroque

 Nationality: English

 Worked in: London

 Selected important works: Dido and Aeneas (1689), Funeral Music for Queen Mary (1695)

 Interesting information: Organist at Chapel Royal during Charles II's reign, the last great

 English composer for nearly two hundred years. His Funeral Music for Queen Mary ended up

 being played at his own funeral.

 A. Scarlatti

Name: Alessandro Scarlatti Dates: 1660-1725 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: Italian Worked in: Rome and Naples Selected important works: Over 100 operas, sacred music Interesting information: Credited with inventing both the da capo aria and the Italian overture.

Albinoni Name: Tomaso Albinoni Dates: 1671-1751 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: Italian Worked in: Venice Selected important works: Many operas, concerti and sonatas, including well-known oboe and trumpet concertos Interesting information: Contrary to popular opinion, Albinoni did not actually write the Adagio for organ and strings with which he is associated.

Vivaldi Name: Antonio Vivaldi Dates: 1678-1741 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: Italian Worked in: Venice Selected important works: The Four Seasons (1725) are four of over 400 concertos Interesting information: Ordained and engaged as a teacher and composer at a Venetian orphanage. Did more for the solo concerto than any other composer.

<u>Telemann</u> Name: Georg Philipp Telemann Dates: 1681-1767 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: German

# Worked in: Hamburg

Selected important works: Operas, church music, instrumental music

**Interesting information:** Possibly wrote more music than any other composer, vocal and instrumental, sacred and secular.

# <u>Rameau</u>

Name: Jean-Phillipe Rameau Dates: 1683-1764 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: French Worked in: Paris Selected important works: Castor et Pollux (1737), keyboard music Interesting information: Successor to Lully as an important French opera composer; his patron was a wealthy Parisian tax-collector.

# <u>J.S. Bach</u>

Name: Johann Sebastian Bach Dates: 1685-1750 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: German Worked in: Weimer, Cöthen and Leipzig, Germany Selected important works: Brandenburg Concertos (1721), The Well-Tempered Clavier (1722-44), St Matthew Passion (1729) Interesting information: Wrote a buge amount of music in every major genre except opera

**Interesting information:** Wrote a huge amount of music in every major genre except opera, whilst holding down important jobs that required him to teach students and compose for weekly services. One of the most influential composers who ever lived.

# <u>D. Scarlatti</u>

Name: Dominco Scarlatti Dates: 1685-1757 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: Italian Worked in: Rome, Lisbon, Madrid Selected important works: Over 500 keyboard sonatas Interesting information: Most of his sonatas were written for the daughter of the Portugese King, in whose service he remained for most of his life.

# <u>Handel</u>

Name: George Frideric Handel
Dates: 1685-1759
Musical period: Baroque
Nationality: German
Worked in: Hamburg, throughout Italy, London
Selected important works: Water Music (1717), Messiah (1742), operas, oratorios, concerti grossi
Interesting information: Landed on his feet in England when his ex-employer in Germany became George I. Was also the first composer-in-residence at the Royal Academy of Music.

<u>Tartini</u> Name: Guiseppe Tartini Dates: 1692-1770 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: Italian Worked in: Padua and Venice Selected important works: 'Devil's Trill' Sonata (c.1713) Interesting information: Was a violin virtuoso, and wrote many sonatas and concertos for the instrument.

# <u>Hasse</u>

Name: Johan Hasse Dates: 1699-1783 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: German Worked in: Dresden and Vienna Selected important works: Operas Interesting information: Almost exclusively wrote operas.

# Pergolesi

Name: Giovanni Batista Pergolesi Dates: 1710-1736 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: Italian Worked in: Naples Selected important works: Stabat Mater (1736) Interesting information: Died young from tuberculosis. Some of his music appears in Stravinsky's Pulcinella.

### <u>Arne</u>

Name: Thomas Arne Dates: 1710-1778 Musical period: Baroque Nationality: English Worked in: London Selected important works: Alfred (1740) – a masque Interesting information: The above work included the song *Rule, Britannia!* This underrated English composer lived in Covent Garden (he is buried in the church there) and was educated at Eton.

# <u>Gluck</u>

Name: Christoph Willibald Gluck
Dates: 1714-1787
Musical period: Rococo/Classical
Nationality: German
Worked in: Vienna and Milan
Selected important works: Orfeo ed Euridice (1762), Alceste (1767)
Interesting information: Gluck is very important in the history of opera. He reformed opera seria, bringing the plot and text back to the fore, and listed his reforms in the preface to Alceste.

# C.P.E. Bach

Name: Carl Philipp Emmanuel Bach

Dates: 1714-1788 Musical period: Rococo/Classical Nationality: German Worked in: Berlin and Hamburg Selected important works: Many keyboard sonatas Interesting information: Son of J.S. Bach, he succeeded Telemann at Hamburg and did much to develop Classical sonata form.

# <u>Haydn</u>

Name: Josef Haydn Dates: 1732-1809 Musical period: Classical Nationality: Austrian Worked in: Esterhazy, near Vienna; also toured extensively Selected important works: Symphony No.94 'Surprise' (1791), The Creation (1798) Interesting information: Known as 'Papa Haydn', considered the 'father' of the symphony and string quartet. Also wrote numerous concerti, operas, sonatas and sacred works.

# J.C. Bach

Name: Johann Christian Bach
Dates: 1735-1782
Musical period: Rococo/Classical
Nationality: German
Worked in: London
Selected important works: Sinfonias, piano concerti, operas
Interesting information: Son of J.S. Bach, he was known as 'the English Bach' and was a big influence on Mozart.

### <u>Paisiello</u>

Name: Giovanni Paisiello Dates: 1740-1816 Musical period: Classical Nationality: Italian Worked in: St Petersburg and Naples Selected important works: II Barbiera di Siviglia (1782) Interesting information: Yes, that's right, Paisiello wrote an opera called *The Barber of Seville* before Rossini, and it was more popular for a time. He wrote over 100 operas in all.

# <u>Boccherini</u>

Name: Luigi Boccherini Dates: 1743-1805 Musical period: Classical Nationality: Italian Worked in: Vienna and Madrid Selected important works: String Quintet op.13 no.5 (contains his famous Minuet) Interesting information: Wrote a huge amount of chamber music, symphonies and church music.

<u>Cimarosa</u> Name: Domenico Cimarosa Dates: 1749-1801 Musical period: Classical Nationality: Italian Worked in: Vienna and Naples Selected important works: Il matrimonio segreto (1792) Interesting information: Succeeded Salieri in Vienna, and wrote many operas and a popular oboe concerto.

# <u>Salieri</u>

Name: Antonio Salieri Dates: 1750-1825 Musical period: Classical Nationality: Italian Worked in: Vienna Selected important works: Operas Interesting information: Court Kapellmeister and supposed rival of Mozart, though few of his operas survive. He taught Beethoven and Schubert.

# <u>Clementi</u>

Name: Muzio Clementi Dates: 1752-1832 Musical period: Classical Nationality: Italian Worked in: London, after touring as a pianist Selected important works: Piano pieces Interesting information: Almost exclusively wrote for the piano, and was a sought-after piano teacher.

# <u>Mozart</u>

Name: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart
Dates: 1756-1791
Musical period: Classical
Nationality: Austrian
Worked in: Salzburg and Vienna; also toured extensively
Selected important works: Symphony No. 41 'Jupiter' (1788), The Magic Flute (1791), Requiem (1791)
Interesting information: Child prodigy who had a towering compositional influence on all

# Cherubini

music, despite only living for 35 years.

Name: Luigi Cherubini Dates: 1760-1842 Musical period: Classical/Romantic Nationality: Italian Worked in: Paris Selected important works: The Water-Carrier (1800) Interesting information: Big influence on Beethoven, whom he met in 1805. Tyrannical professor at the Paris Conservatoire – taught a number of important 19<sup>th</sup> century musical

figures.

Beethoven Name: Ludwig van Beethoven Dates: 1770-1827 Musical period: Classical Nationality: German Worked in: Vienna Selected important works: Piano Concerto No.5 'Emperor' (1809), Symphony No.9 'Choral' (1824) Interesting information: Bridged the Classical and Romantic periods with his immeasurable contributions to the piano sonata, symphony and string quartet. Also wrote one opera.

#### <u>Hummel</u>

Name: Johann Nepomuk Hummel Dates: 1778-1837 Musical period: Classical Nationality: German Worked in: Vienna and Weimar Selected important works: *Trumpet Concerto* (1803) Interesting information: Only really known for the above work, but wrote a lot of piano music that influenced Chopin. Was a pupil of Mozart.

# <u>Field</u>

Name: John Field Dates: 1782-1837 Musical period: Romantic Nationality: Irish Worked in: St Petersburg (and toured extensively) Selected important works: Nocturnes for piano Interesting information: Studied with Clementi and became a virtuoso pianist; his Nocturnes were a big influence on Chopin.

### <u>Paganini</u>

Name: Niccolo Paganini Dates: 1782-1840 Musical period: Romantic Nationality: Italian Worked in: Toured throughout Europe Selected important works: 24 Caprices (1820) Interesting information: Ridiculously talented violin virtuoso – his appearance and ability caused rumours that he was in league with the devil. Many composers wrote works for him.

# <u>Auber</u>

Name: Daniel Auber Dates: 1782-1871 Musical period: Romantic Nationality: French Worked in: Paris Selected important works: La Muette de Portici (1828) Interesting information: Influential opera composer; succeeded Cherubini (his teacher) as director of the Paris Conservatoire. Spohr
Name: Louis Spohr
Dates: 1784-1859
Musical period: Romantic
Nationality: German
Worked in: Germany, Vienna, London
Selected important works: Instrumental music
Interesting information: Violinist and conductor who wrote a number of important instrumental works. Also said to be the first conductor to use a baton!

#### <u>Weber</u>

Name: Carl Maria von Weber
Dates: 1786-1826
Musical period: Romantic
Nationality: German
Worked in: Germany, Vienna, Prague and London
Selected important works: Der Freischütz (1821), many works for the clarinet
Interesting information: Forward-looking and sought-after opera director and composer, who was one of the pioneers of Romanticism, despite dying before Beethoven and Schubert.

# <u>Meyerbeer</u>

Name: Giacomo Meyerbeer Dates: 1791-1864 Musical period: Romantic Nationality: German Worked in: Italy and Paris Selected important works: Les Huguenots (1836) Interesting information: Very rich and successful opera composer, ruthlessly criticized by Wagner in later life (partly due to Wagner's anti-semitic leanings); his works are less popular today.

# <u>Rossini</u>

Name: Gioacchino Rossini Dates: 1792-1868 Musical period: Romantic Nationality: Italian Worked in: All over Italy, and Paris Selected important works: Il Barbiere di Siviglia (1816), Guillaume Tell (1829) Interesting information: Wrote a large number of operas extremely quickly, becoming rich and famous by the age of 30. Many consider him the saviour of Italian opera.

# <u>Marschner</u>

Name: Heinrich Marschner Dates: 1795-1861 Musical period: Romantic Nationality: German Worked in: Dresden Selected important works: Operas **Interesting information:** Not well-known today, but he fills the gap between Weber and Wagner in the history of German Romantic opera.

# <u>Berwald</u>

Name: Franz Berwald Dates: 1796-1868 Musical period: Romantic Nationality: Swedish Worked in: Berlin, Vienna and Stockholm Selected important works: 4 Symphonies, *Piano Concerto* (1855) Interesting information: An amateur composer who left some charming music, still popular today. Struggled to gain much popularity in his lifetime.

# <u>Schubert</u>

Name: Franz Schubert Dates: 1797-1828 Musical period: Classical/Romantic Nationality: Austrian Worked in: Vienna Selected important works: 'Trout' Quintet (1819), Symphony No.8 'Unfinished' (1822), over 600 songs. Interesting information: Best known for his huge contribution to the German Lied, but also

**Interesting information:** Best known for his huge contribution to the German Lied, but also wrote symphonies, sonatas and chamber music.

### <u>Donizetti</u>

Name: Gaetano Donizetti Dates: 1797-1848 Musical period: Romantic Nationality: Italian Worked in: All over Italy, and Paris Selected important works: L'elisir d'amore (1832), Lucia di Lammermoor (1835) Interesting information: Popular and successful opera composer in the Bel Canto style.

# <u>Bellini</u>

Name: Vincenzo Bellini Dates: 1801-1835 Musical period: Romantic Nationality: Italian Worked in: All over Italy, and Paris Selected important works: Norma (1831) Interesting information: Wrote very expressively for the voice. His Casta Diva (from Norma) was made famous by Maria Callas.

### <u>Glinka</u>

Name: Mikhail Glinka Dates: 1803-1857 Musical period: Romantic Nationality: Russian Worked in: St. Petersburg Selected important works: A Life for the Tsar (1836) **Interesting information:** Wrote some songs and chamber music, but concentrated mainly on opera after a trip to Italy in the 1830s.

<u>Berlioz</u>

Name: Hector Berlioz
Dates: 1803-1869
Musical period: Romantic
Nationality: French
Worked in: Paris
Selected important works: Symphonie Fantastique (1830), La Damnation de Faust (1846)
Interesting information: A passionate and emotional man who only played the guitar, he wrote monumental orchestral and choral works that were very forward-looking, especially in their orchestration.

# <u>Strauss I</u>

Name: Johann Strauss the (elder)
Dates: 1804-1849
Musical period: Romantic
Nationality: Austrian
Worked in: Vienna
Selected important works: Radetsky March (1848)
Interesting information: Head of the family that took Vienna by storm with their 'light' music for dancing.

# <u>Rodrigo</u>

# <u>Lambert</u>

<u>Tippett</u> Name: Michael Tippett Dates: 1905-1998 Musical period: 20<sup>th</sup> century Nationality: English Worked in: London Selected important works: A child of our time (1939-41) Interesting information: The above work reflected Tippett's radical politics and pacifist views, for which he briefly went to prison.

<u>Shostakovich</u> Name: Dmitri Shostakovich Dates: 1906-1975 Musical period: 20<sup>th</sup> century Nationality: Russian Worked in: St Petersburg and Moscow Selected important works: Symphony no.5 (1937), String Quartets Interesting information: Hugely influential Russian composer, who was sometimes denounced by Stalin.
